STATE GOVERNMENT AT WORK FOR NEBRASKA DOWN SYNDROME COMMUNITY

On January 11, 2016, the Down Syndrome Diagnosis Information and Support Act was introduced into the Nebraska legislature. To summarize, the Act proposes to require medical professionals who give a diagnosis of Down syndrome to provide the family with specified information pertaining to Down syndrome. In addition to the introducing Senator, 43 Senators co-sponsored the legislation! We are not sure if this is a record, but this is certainly a huge showing of support for Down syndrome awareness in Nebraska. You can find a copy of the legislation on the Nebraska Legislature's website. A hearing before the Health and Human Services Committee has been scheduled for February 11th. You can find your Senator's contact information on the Nebraska Legislature's website to thank them for supporting the legislation. We hope interested individuals from the public will attend the committee hearing to show support. DSAF has been a leader in spreading awareness in the medical community and this legislation highlights the important work of DSAF.

You may also want to check out the Nebraska State Treasurer's website. The Treasurer has created a new website for the new "Enable" program in Nebraska, enablenebraska.com. The Enable program is being created as part of the Achieving a Better Life Expectancy (ABLE) Act, which allows individuals with certain disabilities to save money on a tax preferred basis without being disqualified from receiving government benefits. The Enable website will be updated as the program development progresses. The Treasurer's Office expects that the Nebraska Down syndrome community may be able to start utilizing Enable accounts as early as this summer. Very exciting!

DSAF was involved with supporting the introduction of the Down Syndrome Diagnosis Information and Support Act and DSAF also advocated in support of national passage of the ABLE Act.
